This film chronicles the infamous 1971 Attica prison uprising, a radical yet tragic event in the history of the American Civil Rights Movement.

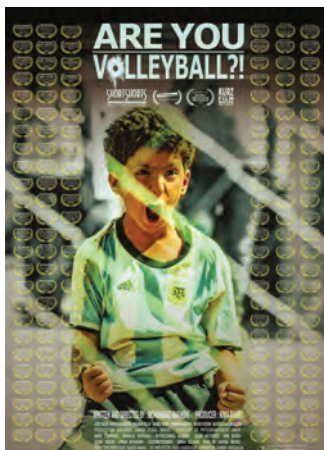

A fading southern town with a massive immigrant detention centre down the road. A mosaic of life in the middle of America's immigration crackdown.

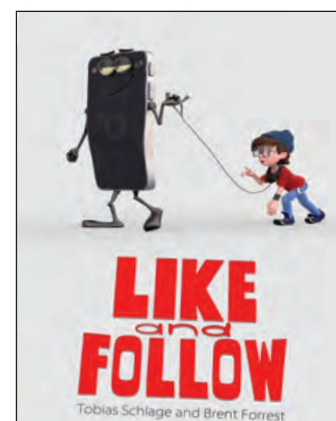
