51% of the UK population are women* and 2018 marks the 100th anniversary of British women gaining the right to vote. For over 40 years it has been illegal to discriminate on the grounds of sex or marital status, yet the fall-out from recent scandals and the ongoing violence and harassment of women on social media and the internet, has made it clear that the struggle for the equal rights of women is far from over.

The criteria for the films this year are that they are all made by women, feature female protagonists and are made in the spirit of liberation.
